

## Autumn Term Update (4)

Dear Parents and Carers

As we come towards the end of a very long Autumn Term, there are a few things I would like to draw your attention to which relate to these last two weeks or future projects.

### Hogwarts Day

Poppy, our Head Girl, made a pledge when she stood for election to run a Hogwarts' themed day for the pupils. For various reasons, we have decided that we will hold this event on **Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> December**. Poppy has been working closely with the teachers to plan the event and it looks like it will be a fun day.

The pupils are invited to dress up for this to help create the atmosphere. This might be by wearing a white shirt as opposed to the school polo shirts, or, if pupils have them, going all the way and wearing Hogwarts cloaks etc. The choice is yours.

During the day, there will be a 'sorting hat' assembly followed by a series of lessons run on a carousel basis. Each class will experience four different lessons during the day, from potions to Herbology; defence against the dark arts to Quidditch. It promises to be great fun.
