Parking and Our Neighbours

In our anniversary year, I am proud of the relationship the school has with our neighbours, particularly those living very close to the school on Broadmead. I am very keen for these relationships to remain positive and would ask that we think carefully when parking along this road before and after school.

There are also safety considerations to think of as well. Given the nature of some of the parking I have seen, and that which has been reported to me, very close to the junction of Whitehill Road, I do worry at times for the safety of pupils as they cross the road and get out of cars as they are dropped off.

As winter draws ever closer and the weather worsens, the grass verges along Broadmead will also become muddy. If cars pull up onto these verges there is a risk that mud will be splashed onto the pavements making them slippery, particularly as they ice up.

It goes without saying, I have no ability to 'police' the parking outside the school grounds myself but would ask for your support and co-operation as we move forwards.

Relationships (and Sex) Education

I have mentioned, in various forms, the move forward with this new and compulsory aspect of the PSHE Curriculum which will become statutory from September 2020. As part of the development of the curriculum at Whitehill, I would like to hold a parent consultation. At this meeting we would outline the Government's plans and explain how we propose to deliver the content at Whitehill.
