**Dear Parents and Carers** 

In line with colleagues in schools across the town, I wanted to provide some reassurance in the light of everything that we are hearing about the Coronavirus.

It is undoubtedly a worry to us all, however schools are in receipt of good and timely advice which is updated regularly and we are being reassured that we should currently be carrying on as normal.

It goes without saying that basic hygiene steps are encouraged at Whitehill. These include regular hand washing and thorough cleaning of key 'touch points' each evening by our site staff.

At the present time, we will be going ahead with the Murder Mystery on Friday evening and we are still planning to hold our consultation evenings scheduled for 31<sup>st</sup> March and 1<sup>st</sup> April. Details for the latter will be coming home at the end of the week.

That being said, my leadership team, in consultation with the governing body are putting together an action plan should we be directed to close as part of an individual case or a blanket closure order from the government. Plans include ways to ensure teachers are able to set work for, and support pupils with this work, at home.
